

Bishop Loveday Curriculum Map 2019-20

The map below details the structure of our curriculum for the foundation subjects for each year group.

Literacy objectives are taught through links to the topic the children are learning in that term – this includes spelling, grammar and punctuation.

Phonics is taught daily in Early Years and in Key Stage 1 using the 'Read, Write Inc Phonics' resources. Reading is taught through whole-class guided reading.

Numeracy is taught using the New National Curriculum Objectives for each year group. There is also opportunity for '*On the Boil*' maths sessions in every year group.
