

Transition to 'Big School'

Our EYFS team will visit every child joining us in September (Covid restrictions allowing), either at their pre-school setting or at a child-minders or at home, if they do not attend a pre-school setting. This provides an opportunity to begin to get to know your child and to ensure that there is a familiar face when they first visit school. We will find out what your child particular likes to do, what helps to comfort them when they are upset and if there is any additional support that could put in place for your child.

During July, we offer your child a 'come and play' session in school, providing an opportunity for you to accompany your child to Early Years. This will enable your child to begin to familiarise themselves with the classrooms and outside spaces and meet the whole of the Early Years team.

Also during the summer term, we will invite parents to an information evening, where we will provide everything you need to know before your child starts Bishop Loveday. This is also an opportunity to meet other parents; to ask any questions you may have about starting school and to share any additional information about your child.

We ask you and your child to complete our 'All about Me' booklet. This tells us about who your child lives with, who else is important in their lives, what they like to play with and lots more!

All children will attend a 'settling in' session during the first two days of school. There will be half the children in each class, for each session and the session will end at lunchtime. Following this, children will attend full time.

A day in the life of an Early Years' pupil at Bishop Loveday

Children begin the school day with a welcome song and the register.

During the morning, children will take part in a phonics session and a maths session. At other times they will either be learning through play or by taking part in adult initiated activities, with a focus on developing their learning. During the week, there are challenges that all the children are encouraged to complete. The indoor and outdoor area will have activities set up to encourage children to explore and learn within all the areas of the Foundation Stage curriculum. Whilst children are encouraged to independently choose where to play and explore, children will also be encouraged to visit areas that they may not naturally gravitate towards, ensuring they experience a broad and balanced curriculum.

Children will tidy up the classroom before lunch and eat their lunch in the hall. This is followed by time in the outside play areas, supported by our Early Years' lunchtime team.

During the afternoon, children will continue with their playing, exploring and EYFS challenges. Each week, children will enjoy a forest school session and an indoor PE session.







Early reading and writing





We use Read Write Inc. Phonics, which teaches children to read accurately and fluently with good comprehension. They learn to form each letter, spell correctly and compose their ideas, step-

by-step.



Click on the image to the left, to watch an EYFS phonic session. As the year progresses, children will begin to apply their phonic knowledge to reading and writing and will enjoy taking their reading books home to share their with parents.

Maths in the Early Years

Learning is through the use of manipulatives (objects that help with our learning) and is very hands-on and practical. Maths play involves problem solving and reasoning. We also learn our numbers 1 - 5 first, then to 10 and 20 and how to place them in order and say which number is one more and one less than a given number. We solve problems involving subtraction and addition, doubling, halving and sharing.

We learn about 2D and 3D shapes and use everyday language to describe their properties. We learn to make patterns and sequences of patterns.

We learn about time and how to sequence events

We learn how to use everyday language to talk about size, weight, capacity, position, distance, time and money. We also compare quantities and objects to solve problems.

Forest School Fun!

The children have a weekly forest school session. They enjoy playing and exploring in the forest school area. Children also learn how to use tools and build fires safely and then enjoy roasting a marshmallow or two! The outside classroom provides a great space to enjoy an 'end of session hot chocolate' in the warm and dry!

Wrap Around Care

We have a breakfast club, that runs from 8am to 8:55am every morning. Children from the reception class to year 6 are able to have breakfast together and play together. We have a member of the EYFS team in breakfast club every day, to make sure that there is a familiar face for our youngest children.

Our school, Christian values of respect, unity, courage, love, friendship and forgiveness guide us in our lives.









We are a growth-mindset school, developing an 'I can' attitude towards our learning. Our superheroes encourage us to develop superhero learning powers!
