Dear Parents and Carers,

### Monday 19th July

From Monday 19th July, there will be no obligation to wear a face mask outside on the school premises. For the remainder of this term, all other COVID related changes will remain in place, including the staggered end of the day, extended opening at the start of the day and one way pedestrian traffic through the front gates.

We plan to return to pre-Covid procedures at the start of the autumn term. I know that, for some parents, this will be new, and will outline the changes before the end of the term.

### Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> July

As a last day treat we have decided to swap hot dinners to Option1 - Oven Baked Butchers Burger in a Roll and Option 2 - Quorn Hotdog.

Please can all medication be collected on Thursday afternoon – please ensure an adult collects it, rather asking the children to take it home. This includes year 5 and 6 children.

Year 6 leavers – at the end of school, Year 6 will bring home their end of BLS reflections, as unfortunately the leavers service was cancelled due to the current risk of infection.

Please remember Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> is the last day of term and we return back on Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> September.

### Year 6 Safety:

With the summer holidays fast approaching the thoughts of your Year 6 children and their parents will be turning to their move on to new secondary schools. They will face many changes at this time, including travelling to school on their own perhaps for the first time.

If children are ill-prepared as pedestrians, they are much more likely to be killed or injured in a road traffic incident, seen by the fact that the number of child pedestrians hurt rises significantly around 10-12 years old – the time at which they begin to go out unaccompanied by adults.

The summer holidays will be the perfect time for your Year 6 children and their parents to prepare for this journey to their new school. The Road Safety team have produced a Transition Guide for Parents, which includes information that will help parents prepare their child for the new journey to secondary school – please see attached.

### Our exciting week of learning:

Year 1 are coming to the end of their learning journey about Brazil and have had fun learning how to dance the Samba this morning. Next Wednesday is our Carnival Day where all the year 1 children will come to school in brightly coloured carnival clothes having made their own musical instruments at home and masks in school.
