Our exciting week of learning:

Early Years we have been learning about the Easter Story and we talked about why we celebrate Easter and how it links to chocolate and new life. We have also been practising our songs for the Easter Assembly on Wednesday 6th April in the School Hall @ 2pm.

In PE we have been doing activities to help us ride a bike.

Year 1 have been looking at how to write instructions, linking their writing to their Science and planting a seed. Some of the children also went to the Warriner Farm for their lambing afternoon and were lucky enough to see a lamb being born.

Year 2 have been examining the artwork of Raku Inoue this term. We have explored the outdoor area to find natural materials that could be used to create images of insects. We learned what the parts of an insect's body are called and then found natural objects that were a similar shape or pattern. We also learned how to use sketching pencils to sketch varieties of minibeasts.















Year 3 have been reflecting on their big question in RE - Does Easter make sense without Passover?

Year 4 have enjoyed a variety of activities this week. Some of the children visited BGN and took part in different cricket skills which focussed on batting, fielding, and bowling. The other half of the cohort enjoyed learning a South African gum boot dance, with Mrs Harris the drumming teacher. All of the children have been learning how to tie an Alpine Butterfly knot in DT, in preparation for making their shaduf in the final week of term.

Year 5 have been learning how to look after and play the scales on Handbells and also getting ready to write their own monologue based on the book The Boy at the Back of the Class.

Year 6 have had a visit from Edd Frost to talk about the role of a funeral director as part of our resurrection topic and also planning to write a speech to the nation.


