Our exciting week of learning:

Early Years this week the last group of children enjoyed their farm visit. We have continued learning our phonic sounds and enjoyed PE and forest school. We have been practicing our Harvest songs and completing lots of harvest activities including vegetable printing using points.

Year 1 have had a very exciting week, starting with a Geography fieldtrip, walking around Bodicote looking for human and physical features. Both classes enjoyed perfect Autumn mornings and the children were able to use their experiences to write some lovely descriptive noun phrases and a recount in Literacy. They have also loved learning a new skill in PE all having a go at French Skipping.

Year 2 have been creating Harvest acrostic poems and thinking about the Autumn that we can see around us. Also in our computing lessons this week, year two had fun using the brand new ipads! They were still able to practise the skill of logging into Purple Mash before using the pointillism tool to make artwork. We explored what happened when we made the paintbrush tool thicker and thinner and when we added more and less water











to the paint. The children learned how to delete mistakes using the eraser tool and how to save a document. In PE this week, we learned how to French skip and in literacy we wrote Harvest acrostic poems.

Year 3 have got messy making Iron Age bread, known as Banno. We have enjoyed some cooking through our design technology lessons. Both classes joined together in the hall and practiced cookery skills to make our Banno. We tasted it on Friday and had mixed reviews...... We are excited for our harvest service next Wednesday, and have been getting ready by singing some beautiful harvest songs.

Year 4 have made a fantastic start on creating their djembe drums in DT and are excited to continue working on their designs. The drums will be used to create and marching drumbeat to help us re-enact The Battle of Edgehill.

Year 5 we have been jiving to some rock and roll music in dance. The children have also been building on their tsunami writing by exploring descriptive vocabulary. In guided reading, they have enjoyed exploring the lyrics to Mary Poppins and Bastille.

Year 6 have started to create their beanie hats this week. They are already showing great skills in sewing, resilience, teamwork and creativity and we look forward to sharing some of the finished designs next week.
