### Our exciting week of learning:

Early Years have been enjoying finding out about different types of jobs. We have had lots of children dressing up as fire fighters, baking cakes (with play dough) and writing postcards in the post office as well as lots of other exciting activities.

Year 1 have been creating artwork on the Northern Lights that links nicely to their topic on the Artic. They have also been producing fantastic Fact Files on Polar Bears.

Year 2 after learning all about different types of materials and their properties, Year two learned about recyclable materials. They gathered lots of materials from home and designed their own robots using these recyclable materials. Finally, this week we got to make them. We made a lot of mess but had lots of fun in the process!

They have also been learning about tone in Art and have discovered Ancient monuments around the world.











Year 3 This week year 3 have tackled weaving! We have started creating replica mini blankets, using the weaving technique which links to our topic, Stone Age to Iron Age. We have also had lots of time rehearsing our Christmas play. Lots of Year 3s know their lines already which is excellent!

Year 4 have been building up to start writing a newspaper article for The Lontown Chronicle reporting the mysterious disappearance of Ernest Brightstorm and his crew. We are really looking forward to reading the finished articles next week!

Year 5 In art we have started to draw geometric shapes, which look amazing! Next week, we will be investigating air resistance and making parachutes. The children have started to prepare the experiment for this. In guided reading, it has been lovely to see the children enjoy an alternative perspective on Humpty Dumpty and The Three Little Pigs - our imaginations have been going wild!

Year 6 have had a practical visit and workshop from IMPS (injury minimization programme for schools) this week in which the children had the opportunity to learn about first aid and how to keep themselves safe.


#### Year 5 & 6 Girl's Football

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
