Our exciting week of learning:

Early Years have enjoyed our winter topic. We talked about the signs of winter and how we need to dress warm. We have made ice, painted with coloured ice, melted ice and chocolate.

Year 1 have enjoyed moving around the jungle in gymnastics and learning about how Kindness is our Superpower in guided reading.

Year 2 have been tasting Tropical fruits and deciding which ones we like. Some of the fruits were new and we had never had them before!! We have also been exploring the Big Question- Is it important to celebrate New Year? They learned about the Jewish celebration of Rosh Hashanah and tasted some of the traditional foods eaten at this festival including Challah bread, apples and honey and pomegranate. The children were very reflective and thought carefully about the significance of these foods and what purpose they served at the beginning of a New Year for people of the Jewish faith.

Year 3 have enjoyed learning about Volcanos and have completed a fantastic piece of writing about them.

Year 4 have been sketching Egyptians in their Art Lesson and also drawing hieroglyphics which they will make from plastic next week. They have also been recording the temperature of their classroom on a spreadsheet in DT.

Year 5 have enjoyed learning about Queen Victoria in History. The have been getting creative and have produced some wonderful homework, including: videos, PowerPoints, posters, crowns and fact files. 5JM enjoyed their first swimming session on Thursday and 5SJ have been practising for the athletics competition coming up at BGN.

Year 6 have been fully immersed in their WW2 learning this week: they have started some fantastic writing from the viewpoint of an evacuee, looked at Anderson Shelter structures in DT and have also enjoyed a live SCARF lesson in PSHE in which they learnt about safe and unsafe risks. They are also looking forward to a visit from Miss Shilling's grandad next week, who is coming in to share his own experiences of life as an evacuee during WW2.


Places will then be available to book for subsequent weeks at a price of £3 per week.


