Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you for your patience while we have determined our approach to the first strike day on Wednesday 1st February. There are three main teaching unions within our school, and the majority of our staff belong to the NEU which has decided to strike; the other unions at this stage are not striking. Therefore, the teachers who belong to the NEU will not be in school on Wednesday, which means we will have partial closure.

The classes that will remain OPEN on Wednesday are: 1SW and 1TV; 4CS; 6PA and 6WW.

Please note that both Netball and Table Tennis will not take place on Wednesday, however Wraparound Care will still be running for those children in school with breakfast club from 8am and WAC from 3.15pm until 6pm.

If your child is in one of the classes which will not be open their attendance will be marked as a Y and this means that their attendance will not be affected.

There are some parents/carers who are eligible for care for their children. This includes those children where parents/carers are critical workers and children who have an EHCP or are in receipt of pupil premium. If you think this applies to you, please complete the form below:-

Our exciting week of learning:

Early Years have had a fun week celebrating Chinese New Year. We have made dancing dragons, decorated lanterns, made envelopes for coins, played in our take away shop and finished with a dragon dance.







Year 1 children's learning has been inspired by their work on Florence Nightingale and they have written some fantastic pieces of non-fiction describing her character and the achievements that make her a world changer.

Year 2 have been very busy thinking about smoothie creation. We have used imperative verbs to create a list of instructions!! In computing this week, Year 2 have been learning how to send and receive emails. When they opened their Purple Mash inbox they found that they had received an email from Baby Bear enquiring about Barnaby who had gone off on his travels around the world. The children had to type replies and attach pictures to their emails. They were so excited when another email would pop up in their inbox (unlike most of us adults!).

Year 3 have had some excellent Maths learning this week, as we start our new unit of work which is length and perimeter. We have measured almost every item available in the classrooms, and got to grips with mm, cm and m. We are continuing to enjoy our topic: Natural Disasters, and thoroughly enjoying our learning about Mount Vesuvius and Krakatoa in Geography and History lessons. Also, the children created some amazing volcano pictures using oil pastels.

Year 4 have been learning all about the fascinating digestive system and making links between the organs and the mummification process in Ancient Egypt. They've been given an exciting task to try at home where they can have a go at mummifying a piece of fruit!

Year 5 have loved exploring charcoal using designs and patterns inspired from artwork by William Morris in Art. The children were lucky to have a visitor to support their learning and understanding around their new RE unit - Does the community of the mosque help Muslims lead better lives? We are extremely proud of our children who demonstrated excellent listening skills, awesome behaviour and fantastic questions.

5SJ enjoyed participating in the athletics events at BGN. They demonstrated great teamwork within their field and track activities. It was lovely to see them participate in a selection of challenging activities against other schools.

Year 6 had a fantastic day today in Oxford at Junior Citizen. They practised how to react in a range of emergency situations and were quoted by the Junior Citizen team to be mature, well behaved and showed great team spirit.




