Our exciting week of learning:

Early Years have been busy learning about London. We went on a virtual tour on a double decker bus and discussed the landmarks.

Year 1 have loved finding out about the role of a firefighter and have written some superb descriptive sentences in preparation for writing a letter next week.

Year 2 have been working so hard on their rainforest posters at home- they are fantastic! – Well done to all the children. On Monday we set up our own art galleries and enjoyed spending some time looking at each other's posters and learning lots of facts about the different animals that live in the rainforest. Thank you so much to parents and families at home for supporting your children with their posters. All of this knowledge feeds into their learning in school and who knows, we might actually get to see some of these animals on our exciting trip to the Living Rainforest next month!



Year 3 have had fun this week in our DT lesson. We have already investigated bridges, so this week we were focussing on designing our own individual bridges from a brief. We have also had a great discussion in our RE lesson this week. Our big question for RE this term asks: What do Christians learn from the creation story? Year 3 have engaged in some great discussions and debates about the creation story, considering our own views, and what some Christians may believe. We have also completed our information text about volcanoes. They are so proud of their 'wow' pages and were very excited to show their work to Mrs Loader and Mrs Warner.

Year 4 have finished writing our adventure diaries about an Egyptian discovery and been learning more about the pyramids.

Year 5 have had another awesome week! We have been working on lots of cross-curricular activities with all things Victorian based. In Literacy, they finished their Victorian flashback writing and should be incredibly proud of their sentences, vocabulary and use of Victorian slang. In Science, we have looked at different rocks and investigated the most suitable material for a Victorian hot water bottle. Ms J and Ms Morrell changed their classrooms on Friday morning and the children experienced what it would be like to learn in a Victorian school. The children participated in etiquette lessons, recited their times tables, sang hymns and learnt about the different punishments.

Year 6 have been learning about Algebra this week and improved their hockey skills in PE. They have also begun to measure and prepare the wood in DT for when they make their Anderson shelters.

Extra-Curriculum Clubs booking system is now closed – we may have a few spaces left in some clubs so please email Mrs Upton if you would like a place.






