We will of course take these reflections on board and do what we can to improve.

You will remember that parents also gave feedback, regarding mixing up the classes within year groups. A vast number of parents could see the benefits of mixing up the classes, although many had concerns about their children's friendships. Traditionally, children were grouped into classes as they entered EYFS. Over time, with additional children joining the cohorts, we have many year groups of children where there is a real imbalance of need across the two classes.

We will be mixing up all of the classes (with the exception of Early Years who will be put into classes within the summer term) for September 2023. We will ensure that children's friendships are taken into consideration and will be asking children to name a first, second and third choice of friend who they would like to be with. Teachers will be integral to the process as they know your children so well - understanding who they work well with and who they are close to. We will ensure that the new classes have an equal split of boys and girls, and that the classes work well in terms of learning and additional needs. We will not be mixing the classes up again the following year, to ensure that classes have time to settle, but will be reviewing it the year after.

The children have learnt about our plans for September in assembly today and have had an opportunity to ask questions. We know that parent support will be impactful in how well children approach the change and would ask parents to share a positive attitude towards this change. If you have any concerns, please speak to myself at the beginning of next term.

Change of school day for September 2023

Statutory guidance, from the Department of Education, for the length of the school day is changing. From September 2023, all schools must be open for 32.5 hours a week. For BLS, this means that we must increase our school day by 10 minutes a day. We will be bringing forward the start of the school day by 10 minutes to allow for this. The gate will open at 8:35am to ensure parents still have the 10-minute window for drop off, and will shut at 8:45am, when the bell goes. Children will need to be in class by 8:45am, when the bell goes, as the register will be taken at this point.

We are also taking the opportunity to bring forward the start of breakfast club, in response to many parents' request. From September, 2023, breakfast club will open at 7:45am.

I know this is a lot of information to have at the end of a busy term, but I wanted to communicate this early so that we have plans in place for September to ease transition.

Parents Meetings will take place on Monday 27th February and Wednesday 1st March – more details will follow on how to book on-line.

Sports Day will take place on Friday 7th July, with Friday 14th being back up in case the weather turns for the worse.

World Book Day This year we will be celebrating World Book Day on Friday 3rd March. We invite all children to dress up as an adjective (describing word). Last year we had great fun and very inventive ideas.

We hope you all have a restful half term and we look forward to seeing you on Monday 20th February for the start of Term 4.

Our exciting week of learning:

Early Years have continued looking at London's landmarks. Some of the children shared photographs with us of their day trips to London. We have also done bridge making over the River Thames. We told the story of the Three Billy Goat's Gruff using musical instruments. We finished a fantastic week in Early Years by joining the whole school for the House Event.

Year 1 have enjoyed drawing around each other in Science, exploring where parts of the body and internal organs can be found. They have thought about the important role each part of the body plays in helping them move and grow.



Year 2 have been learning about multiplication, using practical objects to make groups and add them together. We have also written a diary entry about finding a hat in a spooky forest that has creepy creatures coming out of.

Year 3 have thoroughly enjoyed writing their Newspaper reports in literacy. In Science they were very excited to be erupting volcanoes, with a bit of help from coke and Mentos!

Year 4 been finishing writing their explanation texts about Ancient Egypt and have been getting messy exploring digestion in a science experiment. They have all worked hard all term and should be really proud!

Year 5 have enjoyed exploring the lyrics from the Oliver Twist song 'Pick a Pocket' this week. They even acted out some of the lyrics and had a little sing along during the lesson. The children have also continued to build on their Victorian knowledge and have learnt about the Victorian workhouses. In art, they have finished transferring their design onto their polystyrene tile based on the artist William Morris and will be printing these after half term. In PE, the children have worked on their dribbling, passing and control in hockey.

Year 6 have been coming towards the end of building models of their Anderson Shelters which are looking fantastic. They have also been big write up on


Safer Internet Day 2023


This year, our whole school took part in a range of lessons and activities to spread awareness about the importance of how to stay safe online.



Year one learned about internet safety during their Guided Reading lesson. They had a story about DigiDuck! We had good conversations about how we can stay safe online.

Year 4 explored issues that are difficult to manage online. Year 5 and 6 both took part in a live lesson exploring the risks of online gaming.




