Dear Parents and Carers,

I have attached a timeline, outlining more detailed plans for transition to the new classes. 
Our exciting week of learning:

Early Years have had a very busy week... we have used a very large map outside to find land, sea and countries that make up the UK. We celebrated Shrove Tuesday by eating pancakes with our favourite toppings and had a pancake race outside. On Thursday the children took part in a folk music workshop learning lots of musical instruments.

Year 1 have been outside this week for Science to explore the changes in seasons, looking at the trees in our garden and our vegetable patch. They will be exploring the changes in a few weeks' time and collating it all in a book.

Year 2 have been learning about multiplication. In our maths lessons, we have been using cubes to make equal groups and write matching addition and multiplication sentences. We have also used the peg boards to make arrays and explored how these can help us with our times tables. In literacy, we have been learning about the features of a non-chronological report and began gathering facts about sloths in preparation for writing our own reports next week.





Year 3 have had a great first RE lesson this term. We are studying Easter and our Big Question is "Why do Christians call the day Jesus died good Friday?". We introduced our new topic linking in Shrove Tuesday and lent with a great lesson with pancakes! The children are also enjoying our new topic - The Romans.

Year 4 have really enjoyed taking part in a kindness workshop and worked hard to make gifts and write messages to send to a child who has been poorly in hospital. They have also started to learn about the wonderful world of computer coding!!

Year 5 have started a new unit in maths and have been multiplying fractions. The children have done amazingly well remembering their fractions knowledge from Term 2 to answer tricky questions. On Monday, they printed their art designs which have come out beautifully and we will continue to add to their design and do some more printing next week. It's getting a little juicy in our class read text and the children have been hooked with the plot in Cogheart. We look forward to reading some more and seeing where the book takes us in the coming weeks - eeeek!

Year 6 have been writing about a video called Titanium using dialogue in their writing. We have also been doing decimals in maths and earning lots of Silver BLS Awards – well done.


