## Our exciting week of learning:

Early Years have started their week with some children going to the Farm. We have completed lots of farm related challenges including ordering the life cycle of a frog and then making it into a headband. They enjoyed playing in the snow and used paints to make the snow different colours. We ended our exciting week with a further group of children going to the farm.

Year 1 have had fun in Maths measuring things around the classroom and have loved our Literacy story, Caterpillar Shoes. Their History learning looked another world changer, Mary Anning and they have started to design their sock puppets in DT.

Year 2 have been doing gymnastics. This week we used the apparatus to explore different balances. We had to tense our muscles and be very poised, so we didn't fall over! Some of us worked in partners whilst others used the mats. 


