Dear Parents and Carers,

Since sharing our plans for mixing up the classes in September, I have met with a couple of parents who have asked for more information on our rationale.

The original newsletter stated that, 'over time, with additional children joining the cohorts, we have many year groups of children where there is a real imbalance of need across the two classes.' The imbalances are different across the school but include gender, ability and SEND. Having classes that are better matched is beneficial for the planning stage of the teaching and learning and for the implementation of the curriculum, supporting us to deliver the best quality of teaching and learning to all and enabling us to provide more balanced TA support across the school.

We understand that there will be children who find change trickier. During lockdown the children enjoyed being in different groups, and many did not

initially want to return to their old classes. The reality was, that they settled back into their old classes as quickly as they had settled in the temporary groups. We hope to minimise this by ensuring that every child has a 'friend' who they feel confident to be with - as explained before, children will have the opportunity to identify 3 friends who they work well with.

Children in almost every other school in the Banbury Partnership and in every other school in the Warriner MAT have the opportunity to work within different groups of children every year. Parents have raised the concern that less outgoing children may have their confidence set back, but our research shows that in reality, mixing the groups of children has a positive impact in the long term. If you are concerned about your child during the transition period, please speak to their class teacher.

Teachers will be putting together 'clusters' of children, based on the feedback from the children. When putting clusters together to form the two classes, they will also take into consideration where children have spoken with them about ongoing issues with other members of their class. Please note that what we cannot assure them of, is that there will not be members of their new class that they 'didn't want to be with'. We only have two classes and have 60 children to allocate across the two classes. We also know that, for their own personal development, it is good to work alongside children with different personalities and strengths.

We had a lovely start to the week with children in years 4 visiting a care home in our community as an act of kindness. They took a box of kindness with them to help spread more kindness across our community.

Our exciting week of learning:

Early Years have been learning about Easter. We have listened to the Easter Story and talked about how we prepare for and celebrate Easter. We have starting learning our Easter Songs ready for the Easter Service on 30th March and completed lots of Easter crafts.

Year 1 some of our children have been lambing at the Warriner Farm. We have been making sock puppets in DT and learning about Marie Curie in History.

Year 2 have been learning about the artist Raku Inoue. We went outdoors to gather natural objects which resemble insect body parts. Next week we will be using them to create our own insect artwork inspired by this artist.

Year 3 have had another fantastic and busy week! In English we have been exploring features of persuasive speaking and writing, ready to write our own persuasive texts next week. In Maths we are enjoying our new unit on Mass and Capacity and have had some great practical lessons using litres and millilitres to measure water! We have also loved our indoor PE this term which has been dodgeball. We have learned new skills such as counterattacking and dodging!

Year 4 have been working to investigate shadufs that were used to in Ancient Egypt to move water. They will be designing them this afternoon ready to make for next week!

Year 5 have had an amazing week! They have written some incredible inner monologues based on the character Little Freak. In maths, they have explored thousandths on a giant number line and built upon their fractions and decimals knowledge. Our class read, Cogheart, has kept us on the edge of our seats! We are coming to the end of the story and the children are loving all the twists and turns - what a fantastic book! Today, they have enjoyed exploring the Black Country Living Museum and have been excellent representatives for the school.

Year 6 have created some amazing suspense story writing this week based on their class text - The Nowhere Emporium. They thoroughly enjoyed the opportunity to share their stories with their peers outside in the sunshine too. Furthermore, Year 6 are currently in a TT Rockstar battle against the BLS teachers!






Sports Day will take place on Friday 7th July, with Friday 14th being back up in case the weather turns for the worse.


