### Our exciting week of learning:

Early Years have shared our holiday news, listened to the story of the gingerbread man and done lots of activities around the story. We re-told the story of the gingerbread man using different instruments for each of the characters. We have also been looking at transport and the different ways in which we travel to places. When the sun came out we enjoyed using our outdoor area.

Year 1 had a very exciting trip to the Butterfly Farm in Stratford learning about lifecycles and enjoyed a relaxing boat trip on the Avon. They also had great fun outside in the sunshine playing head, shoulders, knees.... Socks!

Year 2 learned all about the history of Folk music during their workshop with Katie from the Oxfordshire music service. They were able to explore lots of different instruments and played along to a rhythmic song about Mary Mack who was getting married! In maths we have been weighing and comparing measurements. In literacy we listened to the story of Jack and the Beanstalk and put the story in the correct sequence.

Year 3 have had a fantastic first week back and have been really engaged with our new topic for Terms 5: The Anglo Saxons. In our first History and Geography lessons, we have explored our history chronology timeline, and why the Romans went back to Rome and key facts about the Anglo Saxons. We have also introduced our new RE unit for term 5 which is all about Hinduism. In PE, we have started learning about our sport for this term: Rounders, 3DC had a brilliant time doing PE with children from Frank Wise School.

Year 4 have started their new learning this term which is all about Mountains, Rivers and Oceans. They have been using their geographical skills to locate the major rivers and mountain ranges around the world.

Year 5 are looking forward to exploring our new topic 'Ancient Maya' this term and learning more about their way of life. Year 5 have enjoyed the Rain Player book in guided reading, in preparation for writing their own Mayan folk tale in Literacy. They have also enjoyed returning to swimming and starting tennis this week.

Our Kindness Ambassadors have been busy making cards and spreading kindness for people who are recovering in the Horton Hospital. We hope the beautiful cards will spread some sunshine 🙂



Year 6 have been working really hard on their special work this week and the teachers are really proud of the effort they have put in in preparation for their SATs. They have also started working on their Still Life art project and have been exploring the heart.
