Our exciting week of learning:

Early Years have been learning about continents. We have looked at where in the world our food comes from and which animals live on what continent. We have also been having fun making our own passports and enjoyed an African Drumming Workshop.

Year 1 have been retelling the story of Goldilocks. They have also been fantastic when counting in 2s, 5s and 10s – let them show you at home.

Year 2 have been learning how to tell the time in maths. In literacy we have been writing an alternative ending to Jack and the beanstalk- with a twist! In RE, our big question is, do religious symbols mean the same to everyone? We have been learning about Judaism and Jewish symbols and what they represent. In PE we have been doing a fitness and it has been great to join both classes together outside.

Year 3 have had another great but busy week of term 5! This week we have explored our new topic The Anglo-Saxons, in more detail through our Geography and History lessons. In Maths this week, we have tackled some of the trickiest fractions yet in year 3! The determination and courage to keep going is brilliant to see within all of our year 3s. Well done! They have also thoroughly enjoyed their African drumming session and are excited for weekly lessons in year 4. They have also enjoyed Science experiments, investigating the hypothesis: Does a larger femur make you jump further.

Year 4 children at Hill End have had a great time den building in the woods showing great team building skills and having a go at making fire. They have enjoyed smores around the campfire and played the most epic game of hide and seek! This morning they have been involved in nature and habitat based activities.

Year 5 are exploring their topic 'Ancient Maya'. In geography, they have looked at Mexico - including where it's located, the landscape and climate. The Rain Player book in Literacy, has helped us develop our own folktale. The children have enjoyed learning about the different Mayan gods which has enabled them to create their own ideas to adapt the story. We are really excited to start writing these next week!

Year 6 have been learning about functions of blood and the circulatory system. They have learnt some amazing biological facts!
