Our exciting week of learning:

Early Years have been finding about our new King, King Charles III and the Coronation. On Thursday all the children came to school dressed as Kings and Queens.

Year 1 have been learning about breathing in and out and pretending to be lungs as parts of their fitness in Indoor PE. They have also read Goldilocks and Just the One Bear as an alternative to Goldilocks and the Three Bears and compared the two stories.

Year 2 have been learning about fractions. They explored splitting groups of objects into equal groups and found halves, quarters and thirds of an amount. On Purple Mash, we began designing the net for our 3D car which will cover the chassis on the model we are making. The children chose a variety of tools and colours which they wanted to use on their model car. In science, we had a closer look at the tadpoles and observed how they had changed over the past couple of weeks. We are hoping some will sprout some legs soon!

Year 3 have had a fabulous week this week. We have had the most amazing and engaging experience at The Ashmolean Museum where we have discovered and learned so much more about The Anglo Saxon period of History and Anglo Saxon life. The children were a credit to Bishop Loveday. We have also enjoyed Science learning where we have learned scientific names for bones in the human skeleton, and RE where we have explored Hinduism in more depth.

Year 4 have been working hard to finish writing up their narrative piece based on Danny MacAskill's incredible mountain biking stunt on The Ridge in the Isle of Skye. We can't write to see the final drafts!

Year 5 have had an excellent week participating in Bikeability. The instructors have been really impressed with their focus, enthusiasm and questions to further support their understanding in road safety. In literacy, they have started to write their Maya folktales (inspired from The Rain Player) and we're really looking forward to reading their final story.

Year 6 have been working so hard in preparation for their SATS next week - we are so proud of all of them! They have also enjoyed cricket and tennis in PE, as well as created their first still life art drawings of fruit. This will develop over the coming week into a fabulous, finished piece of still life artwork worth of display!

Afterschool have been creative over the last week decorating the school hall in preparation to celebrate the Kings Coronation. We have also made crown biscuits and decorated cupcakes.

Some of our year 2 children had a lovely morning at the NOSSP All Stars Cricket Festival.


