Our Week of Learning:

Early Years we have been talking about who is in our family and drawing pictures of our family. We have started to learn our phonics pictures and listened to different versions of the story Goldilocks and the Three Bears

Year 1 have had an exciting week. We found some clues outside which led us to a little, mysterious, blue creature and a book... which we found out was all about a 'Bog Baby'...





Year 2 have been creating impressionist artwork on the iPads using a range of tools. They explored what happened when they added more and less water to their brushes and changed the thickness of the paintbrush. They also went outside to investigate what sort of buildings can been seen from the grounds of our school. We spotted Saltway nursery, lots of houses, the garage and the council building. Next week, we will widen our investigation and begin thinking about significant buildings around the world.

Year 3 have really enjoyed writing their own descriptive narrative based on the story 'Rides of Passage' that links to their learning of Stone Age to Iron Age. They have been introduced to their new History and Geography learning and have made their own pre-History timelines as well as making jigsaw puzzles of the world and finding the continents and oceans.

Year 4 have written some lovely prayers for the class worship book and 4CS showed lots of enthusiasm during our first drumming lesson.

Year 5 have been immersing themselves in Greek myths this week and understanding why stories were told. In maths, they have been exploring number and place value with numbers up to 1 million. 5JM enjoyed the start of their swimming lessons whilst 5SJ worked on some dance aerobics.

Year 6 have thoroughly enjoyed working with the 'Activators' team learning about ways to keep a healthy mind and a healthy body. We had great fun participating in a range of activities on the field, and are very much looking forward to our session next week. In writing, we have been creative and written poetry based on the short video 'The Dreadful Menace.' We included personification, similes, metaphors, symbolism and hyperbole. We enjoyed performing our poetry to each other. What a great week!




