Please see below about attendance and Government guidelines. Just a little reminder that we always have learning available for children from 8:45am and the gates will be locked at 8:55am.

#### Attendance

Due to Government guidelines and Oxfordshire County Council guidelines, the way we monitor attendance is now on a weekly basis.

- All children who arrive at school after 9.10am are marked as unauthorised for the morning register.
- Parents/Carers are required to notify us by 9.30am the reasons for their child's absence, otherwise this is marked as an unauthorised absence. The easiest way to notify us is via our website <u>Report Absence - Bishop Loveday Cofe Primary</u> (bishop-loveday.oxon.sch.uk)
- Attendance that falls below 90% is categorised as 'persistent absenteeism'. For
  these children, we will contact you to see if there is any support we can put in
  place to support you. We may also ask you to come in to discuss a 'parenting
  contract' (required by OCC) and in some instances a referral will be made to OCC
  for 'notification for fining'.
- We will celebrate good attendance on a weekly basis as we understand for some children this is not achievable on a monthly basis due to reasons we are already aware of.

In case you were not aware, we have an agreement with Banbury Cricket Club that they will allow us to park in their car park for drop off and pick up every day so please could we refrain from parking on the double yellow lines and please remember to park respectfully.

### Our Week of Learning:

Early Years this week we have been looking at different types of homes. The children brought in a photograph of their house and told us a little bit about it. The children had fun in the wind and rain this week. They created their own wind socks and watched them blow around. We have continued to learn our phonic sounds.

Year 1 In science we have learned about the way deciduous trees change throughout the year and used collage to show what trees look like in Spring, Summer, Autumn and Winter. The children have written some fantastic character descriptions of Bog Baby. In PSHE, we have talked about who can help us if we are feeling worried or anxious. 1CW enjoyed PE activities on Thursday led by our recently trained Year 5 Sports Leaders!

Year 2 have had another fantastic week! They have particularly been enjoying our PE this week, where we are exploring fundamental movements in indoor PE, and ball skills in outdoor PE. They are also focussing hard in our Literacy, and creating some great character descriptions to entertain based on dragons.

Year 3 children are enjoying listening to our class text, The Wild Way Home and finding all the links to the Stone Age that they are also learning about in History.

Year 4 have started writing up their final pieces in Literacy explaining how the wishgranter machine works. They are working hard on editing their writing to improve it and presenting their work using their neatest handwriting. We can't wait to read the finished pieces!

Year 5 well done to the children that took place who became Play Leaders this week he said "it was a pleasure to visit Bishop Loveday School. The Year 5 students were really engaged throughout the morning and did a great job leading activates for the Year 1 children." We are also really enjoying out class read especially as the plot is thickening. Who exactly is Prisoner 42?

Year 6 In Dt we have thoroughly enjoyed designing their Beanie Hat and are looking forward to making them! We have some very creative pupils. In History and Writing we have been immersing ourselves in Shackelton's journey to the Antarctic and his incredible adventures. We explored how vocabulary choices can impact the reader then wrote poetry to describe his travels.
