Our Week of Learning:

Early Years started the week with the first group of children going to the farm. They saw lots of animals, collected eggs and made fresh apple juice. We have also looked at the different foods we like and don't like. The children who did not go to the farm had their first PE lesson this week.

Year 1 this week we have been thinking about story structure: beginning, middle and end, and the characters and setting in Goldilocks and the Three Bears and in Bog Baby. The children are well settled into our daily phonics and are enjoying their sessions and partner work. Thank you for your continued support in sharing your children's reading books with them at home... they will be proud to show you how great their reading is!

In our RE lesson this week we have been thinking about ways we can help care for our world, and in science we went outside to hunt for common garden and wild plants.

Year 2 had a very special visitor- a dragon! He appeared in box with some instructions on how to look after him. Unfortunately, the instructions had been destroyed by his sharp claws and hot, fiery breath! We must get to work now on writing our own instructions on how to look after a baby dragon. Watch this space!

Year 3 children have been busy writing their own narratives based on the story Stone Age Boy. They have worked hard imagining how different Bodicote would look to a Stone Age girl who had travelled in time to 2023. They have also really enjoyed linking their humanities subjects. In History, the children have learned about Paleolithic footprints found in Happisburgh in Norfolk and used a map and photographs in their Geography learning to locate Happisburgh on a map and describe what the coastal village is like.

Year 4 children have started to look at writing their own adventure stories based around an unlikely hero. The ideas the children have come up with are super and we can't wait to see the finished pieces. In maths. The children have also been looking at using Cuisenaire's in a practical maths lesson.

Year 5 have had a busy week exploring the character 'Prisoner 42' in 'Who Let the Gods Out' in preparation for their writing. In maths, they have looked at intervals on a number line with numbers up to a million. In science, they are beginning to understand mass (by measuring in kgs) and weight (measuring in Newtons).

Year 6 have been very creative this week! We thoroughly enjoyed performing in our 'Toot Flute' lesson. In DT we are practising basic sewing stitches in preparation for making our beanie hats. On Thursday we had an informative and exciting session with the Activators. We look forward to this session as it allows us time to reflect on how we can look after our mental and physical health. Well done Year 6 - another amazing week!
