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# Our Week of Learning:

Early Years have been looking at vegetables. The children brought into school their favourite vegetable and we talked about where they grow. Using the potatoes the children have collected at the farm, the children created their own supertato. Another group of children went to the farm on Monday and had an amazing time.

Year 1 have been writing their own stories based on our book The Bog Baby, where they find their own magical creature in a setting of their choice. In Maths we have been comparing numbers and learning how to use the 'greater than' ( > ), 'less than' ( < ) and 'equal to' ( = ) symbols. Maybe your child can show you at home! We have enjoyed practising our Harvest songs, ready for the Harvest Festival visit to church next week, and the children's singing is fantastic. They have done so well learning the words to the songs. In RE we have been thinking about the best things about the world and in DT this week we have finished making and evaluating our badges. The children are very proud of them!

Year 2 have been exploring amazing places around the world in our Geography lesson. We discussed if these were human or physical features and looked on the world map at which continent they were located on. In maths we have been learning about fact families and number related bonds and used the classroom equipment to make representations of these. In PE, we have been mastering the fundamentals of hopping, skipping and jumping. We are very excited to dress up at rockstars and practise our skip counting in 2's, 5's and 10's!

Year 3 have worked so hard on writing their Neolithic Village leaflets and have shown great commitment to their handwriting and presentation. They have also enjoyed their gymnastics in PE this week, practising their balance and shape moves on equipment.

Year 4 have been writing letters to send to incredible author Cressida Cowell who wrote our class text The Wizards of Once. The children are telling her about what they have enjoyed in the story and how this has inspired them to either write their own stories or read more amazing books in school and at home.







Year 5 have finished writing their Prisoner 42 narratives and have created a wonderful display in the corridor with their writing. In maths, they have finished the 'Place Value and Number' unit, demonstrating excellent rounding skills and number knowledge with numbers up to one million. We look forward to getting stuck into the new 'Addition and Subtraction' unit next week. DT plans have also started as the children will be making their Archimedes screw on Wednesday.

Year 6 What a fun filled week we have had! Our beanie hats are taking shape and we have been so impressed with the sewing skills demonstrated. It has also been lovely to see the pupils supporting and encouraging each other in the making of their hats. On Wednesday, we had a highly entertaining afternoon watching the Warriner performance of Sister Act. We were wowed by the acting, singing and dancing of all the pupils - what a treat!
