Our Week of Learning:

Early Years have had an amazing week! We celebrated our week of nursery rhymes with a Funkypants afternoon where we sang and had fun doing the actions to our favourite nursery rhymes. We have also taken part in a yoga session and Christmas singing too! We have started looking at the different jobs people do. We finished our week having fun in forest school.

Year 1 this week we have written our own Polar Bear report, using what we learned about these amazing animals and about the features of report writing. We have been learning a dance in groups in preparation for the Key Stage One Christmas Production, and we'll be practising this in the weeks ahead. In RE we have continued to think about our Big Question... 'Why does Christmas matter to Christians?'. We have explored various images which might be seen on Christmas cards to decide whether they depict the story of Jesus or whether they are secular.

Year 2 finished writing their descriptions of Grandma from George's Marvellous Medicine. We are so impressed with the children's effort and creativity and absolutely loved reading their character descriptions. It is amazing to see how much progress they have made in their writing since the start of the year. In History, we have been learning about the pyramids of Giza.

Year 3 As part of our Stone Age to Iron Age learning, Year 3 thoroughly enjoyed making their Bannock bread in DT on Thursday afternoon. They had as much of an authentic experience as possible using cups instead of scales and mixing the dough straight on to the table surface. It was very messy, very sticky but a lot of fun.




Year 4 have really enjoyed exploring light and shadows in our science investigations this week. We are also really excited about beginning our writing based on our class text Brightstorm.



Year 5 have had a busy week concluding their air resistance experiment in science and learning about Alexander the Great in history. During their maths lessons, the children have explored factors, prime, squared and cubed numbers. In our class read 'Holes', the plot has thickened as the children have been exposed to the scary warden character.

Year 6 have had a busy and thoroughly enjoyable week! We welcomed members from the Horton Hospital to lead our IMPS (injury minimization programme for schools) sessions where we learnt some very important skills including first aid, the recovery position and keeping ourselves safe. We complete our poetry writing based on remembrance and WW1 and then presented these beautifully to display in class.





Dear Parents, Students and Music Teachers

Young Musician of the Year 2024

I am pleased to send you details of the **Young Musician Competition for 2024** being held by the Rotary Club of Banbury. The Competition will be held at Warriner School, Bloxham. Preliminary Rounds on **Friday 19th January** and **Saturday 20th January**, and the Finals on **Saturday 10th February 2024**. This competition has run successfully for many years, giving many young people valuable performance experience and, for some, it has been a launch-pad towards a career in Music.

Apart from competing for one of the many trophies, this year a prize of £100 will be awarded to the Young Musician of the Year and £25 to the Junior Young Musician of the Year. There will be trophies awarded to all the winners for each class throughout the competition. So please do take part as a soloist, or perhaps you could form a duet with someone especially for this competition. Where duets have a piano accompaniment part, this may be played by an adult.

This year there will be two Ensemble Classes (Junior, Intermediate/Senior), with separate trophies for mixed and vocal ensembles. All performers in the Junior Class must be 8-11 years of age, the Intermediate/Senior Class may involve younger performers. For all ensembles, where there is a piano accompaniment part, this may be played by an adult. Electronic backing tracks may be used.

More than one piece may be performed in the Preliminary Rounds as long as the time limit is not exceeded, but in the Finals only one piece is required.

Again, this year as there are only a few weeks between the Heats and the Finals, entrants will be given their report immediately after the Heat, and you will be asked to play/sing the same piece if you get into the Final. It is impossible for us to do all the administration and finalize the Final's programme otherwise.

In response to suggestions made by teachers and competitors we will continue with the Junior Finals being held separately on the afternoon of **Saturday 10th February** followed by the Intermediate and Senior Finals later that evening.

You will find enclosed with this letter a handbill, giving full details of the competition, and three application forms. Do join us and help make this another successful year of competition. The closing date for entry is **Sunday 26th November 2023**.
