Our Week of Learning:

Early Years have been practicing our Christmas play. We have used clay to make a Christmas decoration and enjoyed making reindeer Christmas bags. We have continues to work hard learning our phonic sounds and reading words.

Year 1 have learned about algorithms in computing, following a set of instructions. In science we have been finding out about the features of fish, where they live and lay their eggs, what they eat and ways they protect themselves from predators! We've had a very creative Friday afternoon making Christmas decorations to brighten our classrooms up for the period of advent. We are very grateful to the parents who helped us. Thank you!

Year 2 teachers are so proud of the Year 2 children who did their assessments this week. They all worked so hard. They have also been singing their hearts out in their Christmas play rehearsals and acting out their parts in their scenes. In RE this week we looked at crib scenes from around the world and made our own Nativity scenes using playdough. We thought about who the most significant figures were and how we could represent them.

Year 3 have enjoyed using their Iron Age learning to identify local History and local Geography Neolithic monuments at The Rollright Stones. A worthwhile visit about 25 minutes away near Chipping Norton for any families wishing to bring their children's learning to life, during the holidays. (Entrance charge: Adults £1, children over 7yrs 50p) Some of the children were able to describe their experiences having already visited. The Rollright Stones

Year 4 have been learning about the northern lights and are very excited to start their persuasive writing about them. They were really enthusiastic when learning about Louis Braille in guided reading.

Year 5 are absolutely loving their class read 'Holes' and have been getting stuck into lots of comprehension activities based on the text this week. In PSHE, they have been exploring what a healthy and unhealthy relationship is by creating a recipe for a friendship cake. During their outdoor PE session, they have been building on their hockey skills and learning about different passes and ways to control the hockey ball.

Year 6 in computing we have been learning how to use the repeat button when writing our own coding programmes. We designed the background and then used our coding skills to move an object in a square. In geography, we learnt about what Germany is like today and compared it to the UK. We have had a very busy week and we are proud of all the Year 6's achievements!

Multi-Skills Club had a great time on Wednesday as they did a scavenger hunt around the school.
