Our Week of Learning:

Early Years have had a fantastic time in Early Years this week. We have been writing Christmas cards using our phonic knowledge and had a Christmas craft afternoon where we made angels, Christmas trees and snowmen. On Thursday we performed our Christmas play to our parents/ carers. Today we all enjoyed wearing our Christmas jumpers in school.

Year 1 maths this week we have been learning about 2D and 3D shapes and their features. In our literacy lessons we have been exploring how to describe a setting based on our senses of sight, hearing, smell and touch, in preparation for writing our own setting description. We had fun in science sorting a variety of animals into groups; mammals, amphibians, reptiles, birds, fish and insects. We hope you enjoyed our singing and dancing in the Key Stage 1 Production!

Year 2 we are so incredibly proud of our amazing Year 2's and the hard work they put into their Christmas Nativity this year. They each played an important role and we are very proud of all of them. This week we began learning about 2d and 3d shape in maths and also made our own Christmas Carols.



Year 3 have enjoyed the class reading lessons this week and entered into some fantastic conversations about the book Stuart Little by EB White (1945) and the modern day film. They have also loved watching the EFYS and KS1 plays and are very exciting about their own performance on Monday.

Year 4 have finished writing their persuasive texts trying to encourage people to be adventurous and travel to places where they can witness the celestial ballet of the Northern lights. The children have included incredible vocabulary and used grammatical features to write a persuasive piece of writing. After reading their texts, we would all definitely love to go and see the spectacular, natural phenomenon of rainbow ribbons ourselves. Well done everybody!


