Our Week of Learning:

Early Years have been busy learning about spring and the lifecycle of a butterfly. We have been enjoying reading *The Very Hungry Caterpillar* by Eric Carle, making our own caterpillars to show the lifecycle of a butterfly and writing our own version of story *The Hungry Caterpillar*. We even had a visit from Mrs Loader to show her our amazing writing.

Year 1 have created their own animated stories about an animal in ICT. We have enjoyed adding animations and text to our work. We also had a special visitor on Thursday as part of our Science learning about 'life cycles'. Baby Sage came to play! We enjoyed asking questions and finding out more about what babies need to stay healthy.

Year 2 have been making arrays in maths to help us solve multiplication problems. We used the peg boards to make different arrangements of arrays and learned about the importance of having equal rows and columns. In literacy we have been busy writing our non- chronological reports about rainforest animals. We have learned some amazing facts about our chosen animals. As part of our coding unit in computing, we wrote algorithms to programme a princess and frog game. It was great fun!

Year 3 have had such an exciting week of learning. They very much enjoyed their Roman Day where they learnt about 'a day in the life as a Roman', making amongst other things a wax tablet, a painted fresco, a mosaic and a clay pot. They were drilled for battle and learnt how to attack using a bow as well as how to defend using their shields. In the afternoon they became archaeologists, identifying and cataloguing artefacts for a museum.

Year 4 have been working extra hard in Maths to understand how to convert improper fractions and mixed numbers. In RE, they have provided excellent class discussion and deep thinking about why Christians remember the events of Holy Week every year. There has been some fantastic learning happening so keep it up Year 4!

Year 5 We are so impressed with the instructional writing based on How to be a Victorian pickpocket. They have been brilliant to read and a lot of fun creating. In history we have been finding out about the types of jobs in Victorian times and our art focus has been typography.

Year 6 have enjoyed continuing to learn about places of pilgrimage for a Hindu. We learnt about the importance of the River Ganges and the Kumbh Mela festival. In computing, we have begun to write our own adventure text. We are using the 2Connect programme in Purple Mash to create a digital book where the reader can make choices about what happens next in the story.
