### Our Week of Learning:

Early Years have been completing lots of Easter activities including making Easter biscuits. The children brought into school the hats they have made for our Easter assembly, they looked incredible and lots of hard work has gone into them. Thank you parents/carers for helping the children make their hats. We finish our term with our Easter assembly and have shared a book with our parents/ carers.

Year 1 have been learning a performance poem called The Nut Tree, by Julia Donaldson. We have enjoyed adding actions and practising the rhythm of the poem to a drum beat.

Year 2 have been writing letters to the Prime Minister to try to persuade him to stop deforestation. They used emotive language, rhetorical questions and technical language that they have learned through our rainforest topic. We hope you enjoyed reading some of them during parent's evening. In History, we learned about some of the equipment that explorers used to navigate their way around the world on their ships. We hope everyone has wonderful Easter break.

Year 3 loved their science this week, they dissected a flower and learnt about the component parts. They showcased their work in their books!

Year 4 have written up their exciting Varjak Paw stories and they look amazing! In science they have been using classification keys to identify different animals and plants.

Year 5 have been creating 3D maps showing the different facets of our personalities based on work by the artist Grayson Perry. In maths we have been comparing fractions, decimals and percentages and in RE we answered the big question. In PE, we used different rolls and balances to create a sequence.

We are all proud of our achievements over the term and are ready for a well-earned break.

Year 6 have been learning about democracy and how our voting system works. In small groups, the children created their own party, putting forward a candidate and manifesto. They presented this to the class and then we carried out a vote. The children were extremely thoughtful and their presentations were a credit to them. Well done!

Lucia F (3DC) achieved a certificate for swimming 400 meters with Kick n Splash


